Strategy 1 Green the Toronto region's economy

 Provide input into the development of provincial legislation, policies and guidelines within prescribed timelines (e.g. CA Act enabling regulations, MOUs/SLAs, ERO postings), Q1- Q4

Strategy 2 Manage our regional water resources for current and future generations

- Source Water Protection new Aurora Well (Q2), Amendments to CTC Protection Plan incorporate new technical information and related policies, definitions (Q4); Annual Report on Implementation (Q2 4th year of Plan.; Q4 prepare 5th year)
- Develop jurisdictional Water Resource System new comprehensive data layers e.g. instream thermal temperature of reaches, ecologically significant groundwater areas, wetlands, HDFs, etc. Q4 to SLT
- Special Policy Area Reviews/Updates coordinate policy, planning and technical input municipal and provincial timelines Q1 –Q4 (e.g. Unionville SPA boundary update, Dixie-Dundas/Etobicoke Creek SPAs, Bram East SPA, finalize Bolton, Lake Wilcox, Hoggs Hollow)
- Aquatic and Wetland ecology research quantify cumulative impacts of stormwater ponds on aquatic habitat (Q4 – Report); development of KPIs for benefits of wetland restoration/creation (Q4)

Strategy 3 Rethink greenspace to maximize its value

- Complete Natural Heritage System Update by Q4 integrating municipal natural system layers, habitat connectivity priorities, climate vulnerabilities, terrestrial and aquatic species habitat needs and policy criteria to develop regional NHS; data layers to inform watershed planning and MCR processes
- Update TRCA policies, guidelines and procedures to conform with new legislation (Q3/Q4 into 2021)
- Planning Ecology update guidelines, including Internal Review Protocol for TRCA Projects (Q3 SLT)
- Urban Forest Planning manage and update all York Region studies (i.e. York/lower-tiers -5 year project) - 2020 state of forest report Q4; research incorporating forests into York Region's Green Infrastructure Asset Management Q3; Town of Ajax Urban Forest Study Q2-Q4

Strategy 4 Create complete communities that integrate nature and the built environment

- Collaborate with DES to support streamlining initiatives, training, enhancing relationships with municipalities, development industry (e.g. BILD Working Group and Sub-Committee) Q1 – Q4
- Planning Ecology: achieve review timelines, digital review and technology upgrades, coordination with technical disciplines to achieve consistency (Q1 -4)

Strategy 7 Build partnerships and new business models

- Greenbelt Golden Horseshoe CA Collaborative (13 CAs)
 – bring forward items for cross jurisdictional information and action to increase regional collaboration, Q1- Q4
- TRCA Research Partnership Toolkit coordination TRCA, municipal partners, academic partners (Q4 SLT)

- Annual update to Regulation mapping to incorporate most current technical information to inform development and infrastructure reviews, permitting decisions, Solicitor/Realtor Inquiries -Q4/Q1 2021 Board Report
- Lead terrestrial, aquatic, urban forest and water quality/quantity components of the Etobicoke Creek Watershed Plan (Q4)
- Support land use and infrastructure plan review through development of guidelines and tools wetland water balance decision support tool (Q3), evaluate valley and stream crossing guideline (Report to SLT Q4), Improve LID treatment train tool (Q4)
- Support Peel Climate Change Partnership strategic planning, implementation and reporting of the Green Infrastructure Strategy (Q2-Q4)

Strategy 9 Measure Performance

Undertake Business and Financial Planning for the Division including review and development
of updated metrics and key performance indicators (KPI) Q4; provide timely divisional metric
and performance information (e.g. financial, service delivery standards - planning ecology
review, solicitor/realty inquiries) Q1 –Q4

Strategy 11 Invest in our staff

 Set individual strategic and divisional objectives Q1, providing staff training (health and safety, specialized training), re-staff and build team capacity (Q1-Q4)

Strategy 12 Facilitate a region-wide approach to sustainability

 Provide input to Municipal Comprehensive Reviews (MCRs) on technical/background studies, draft official plans/amendments – Upper tier conformity by July 2022; Lower-tier conformity July 2023; Q1- Q4
