Restoration & Infrastructure – Priorities

- Standardize estimating across R&I and work with other divisions to ensure there is consistency in agreement templates, project proposals, and project invoicing of fee for service projects
- Finalize the Metrolinx multi-year compensation partnership for TRCA to replace lost natural cover and impacts to Species at Risk
- Secure commitment from Vaughan for TRCA to implement priority restoration and trail projects as part of their Greenspace Strategy Plan. Work to first target North Maple Regional Park and the Vaughan Super Trail

Restoration & Infrastructure – Challenges

- Centralizing and maintaining up to date information related to existing and proposed projects to coordinate internally and respond to corporate or public inquiries. Improving this requires consistent use and improvements to ICEBERG/CPR to improve functionality for these purposes.
- The Glen Haffy Master Plan planning process has brought to light that the Extension Ponds are in a very poor state and require immediate attention.
- Gypsy Moth outbreaks have been significant this year and are expected to worsen in 2021.
- Field Staff engagement during COVID-19 due to offsite working arrangements.

Restoration & Infrastructure – Required Cooperation

- Continue to work closely with PMO and other teams that manage projects to develop a project triage process and seek opportunities to build greater capacity to manage major contracts and secure professional services
- Work with ITM to find a new Project Management platform to assist with scheduling, tracking, and managing resources and equipment to replace TeamGantt
- Work with E&T, P&C, and CM&E as well as project partners to coordinate COVID-19 community engagement procedures (e.g. planting) and support the development of a consistent communication strategy

Restoration & Infrastructure – Heads Up

- Markham is finalizing the "Greenway System Restoration Framework" for their Future Urban Area based on TRCA's restoration planning and prioritization program
- Staff closely watching the province's first Doublecrested Cormorant "hunt" to note any potential impacts to TTP

Erosion Hazard Monitoring - Landslides



- Slide occurred midday on a sunny, summer weekend along a public beach on Sunday, August 23
- TRCA staff established monitoring locations a safe distance from the crest of the Bluffs in addition to deploying RPAS pilots to fly the area
