

Supplies List



Acrylic Paints – Entry level paints, Walmart (Dowler Rowney), or others that you already have on hand. They have a multi pack of 12 if you wish which has all the colours you will need or you can buy singles or similar colours. This is fairly flexible. You will need a large tube of black



Leaves from the ground

- Gather some different sized leaves from outdoors. Maple or oak or others that are around. Different sizes too. You can press flat in a book or use as found.

Canvas – 11" x 14", Use a stretched canvas, available at Michaels or Walmart

- Paper is not advised because you need something sturdy for the acrylic paint

Water Cup

- Use an old mason jar or other

Paint brushes

- ½" flat brush
- ¼" flat brush
- ¾" flat brush

Hair Dryer

- Since we are trying to complete a painting rather quickly, it's helpful to have a hair dryer to help speed up the drying process between layers, but it's not crucial.

Chalk

- This is a useful trick for sketching outlines

Paper towel

Newspaper

- To keep your work surface clean

Palette

- I use a hard surface about 12x14 size covered with wax paper
